**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** That the sum of \$23,699,010 is hereby appropriated for expenditure pursuant to the foregoing annual budget for the twelve month period January 1, 1999 through December 31, 1999 and the Secretary of Interior or his/her authorized representative is hereby requested to approve such budget; and,

**BE** IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the appropriated funds for non-capitalized programs shall be eligible for expenditure for a period not to exceed 2 calendar years and that the appropriated funds for capitalized items and projects shall be eligible for expenditure until the projects are completed; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary-Treasurer of the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon is hereby authorized to proceed with the expenditure of funds for the purpose and amounts dicated in the budget, provided that all constitutional provisions are met.
